



Information about Reemployment Services for Extended Unemployment Compensation Benefits Claimants

The Congress of the United States passed legislation in February 2012, signed by the President, creating the Middle Class Tax Relief and Job Creation Act. This law extended the ending date of the Emergency Unemployment Compensation (EUC) until January 2, 2013. This Act also established additional requirements for newly established claims for EUC Tier I and those claimants transitioning from EUC Tier I to EUC Tier II. The requirements provide the following: an EUC claimant must:

- **Be able, available and actively looking for work each week.**
- **Keep a record log of one's work search contacts to include, the date of contact, employer contacted, method of contact and to provide this log when requested. These job contacts are subject to verification.**
- **Be Registered with the Virginia Workforce Connection as directed.**
- **Report in person and participate in any required Reemployment Services when instructed. Failure to report as directed may result in a delay or denial of your EUC benefits.**
