#### The Virginia Employment Commission (VEC) promotes economic growth and stability by delivering and coordinating workforce services.

The VEC offers career assistance and employment opportunities for job seekers, employer services for businesses of all sizes, employment services for veterans, unemployment insurance benefits to eligible individuals, and other programs designed to assist with employment.

# **Employment Services Statistics**

#### In 2018:

- The VEC was the single largest source of job candidates in Virginia.
- · More than 200,000 individuals used employment services.
- Over 78% of job seekers entered employment within 6 months of receiving their last staff assisted service.

# **Job Openings Received From Employers**

- 40% Professional, managerial, technical, clerical, sales and administrative support
- 19% Production and manufacturing
- 15% Transportation, material moving and protective services
- 13% Construction, cleaning, maintenance and repair
- 11% Food preparation/serving, personal care and health care support
- 2% Farming, fishing, forestry, and military specific

**VEC Workforce Centers and One-Stop Offices** are located across the Commonwealth with professional staff who are available to assist with employment searches and other employment issues. Access to computers and fax machines are also available to job seekers.

The VEC offers many services that can assist job seekers, employers, veterans, and the unemployed.



The **Virginia Workforce Connection** is a website supported by the VEC that offers job seekers and employer services, unemployment insurance services, veterans services, labor market information, and more.

#### Veterans receive priority of service at the VEC, Virginia's largest provider of employment services to veterans.

- Dedicated VEC veterans' representatives provide outreach and technical assistance to employers seeking to hire veterans.
- Veterans receive early access to job openings.
- Veterans with barriers to employment receive intensive services to prepare them for work.
